## What is Creekside and what services do they provide?

Creekside is a residential facility for children and adolescents ages 5 through 17, who are at risk for psychiatric hospitalization.

Services Include:

- Assessment
- Individualized Crisis/Treatment Plan
- Crisis Intervention
- Individual/Family Counseling
- Psychiatric Assessment and follow up when needed
- Collaboration with involved service providers
- Discharge Planning and linkage to community resources
- Referral to appropriate service providers

### Creekside Mission:

To assist children and adolescents in crisis by providing intensive community based interventions prior to an escalation of symptoms that could lead to hospitalization.

## Creekside Crisis Stabilization Unit for Children and Adolescents



**The staff work to meet the individual needs of each child. All staff are trained to de-escalate crisis situations. The program provides the option of managing acute psychiatric symptoms or behavioral problems in a setting less restrictive than longer term psychiatric hospitalizations.**

## Criteria for Creekside Admissions

- In crisis (i.e., suicidal ideation, serious impulse control problem, etc.) but can be treated safely in an open setting.
- Evaluation by a mental health professional within the past 24 hours.
- All services are voluntary. **CREEKSIDE IS NOT A LOCKED FACILITY.**
- Child and parent/guardian must agree to admission.
- Child must not have legal charges more than beyond parental control/school control.
- Child must not require seclusion or excessive physical management.
- Children and adolescents with a history of sexual offenses will be evaluated on a case by case basis.
- Children with a primary diagnosis of substance abuse or who require intensive medical or psychiatric care are not appropriate for this program.
